
## **CERVICAL FACET JOINT PAIN**

Cervical facet joint syndrome has several potential causes, such as repetitive movement, trauma, or arthritic changes.

## Symptoms-

- 1. Neck pain that generally doesn't radiate into the arms
- 2. Upper back pain that can affect the shoulders
- 3. Pain between the shoulder blades
- 4. Headaches, typically located in the back of the head
- 5. Swelling and tenderness at the site of the inflamed facet joint



<u>Treatment plans</u> may include, physical therapy, chiropractic care, NSAIDS, ice, heat, facet injections or MBB's with the goal of a RFA procedure.

<u>A cervical facet injection</u> refers to a clinical procedure where a facet joint that is inflamed or injured within the neck is injected with steroids to reduce the pain. It is performed under the guidance of an x-ray.

<u>A medial branch block</u> is an injection that is a precursor for a RFA procedure that is a strong local anesthetic on the medial branch nerves that supply the facet joints.

<u>Radiofrequency ablation</u> is a procedure that uses heat from high-energy electromagnetic waves to destroy nerves that carry pain impulses. This procedure may be a treatment option for people who have already tried therapeutic injections and found that they only provided temporary relief from neck pain.
